Easter Celebrations

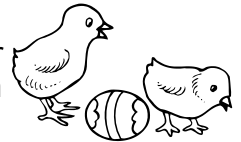


Over the coming weeks the children will be learning about Easter and there will be a range of exciting activities that they can participate in at school.
