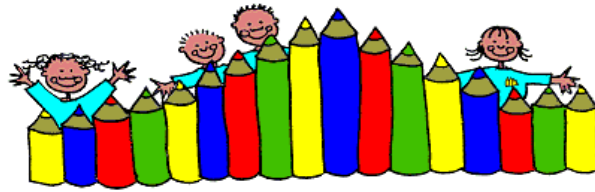


# Oldbrook First School

### Parent Questionnaire Results

Thank you to all parents who recently completed the parent questionnaire at the last consultation evening to share your views about Oldbrook First School. This is one of the ways in which the Governors and School Leadership Team seek the views of parents and we place great importance on your responses. The survey results show overall high levels of parental satisfaction with the school: most results were in the high 90's. These results are a very positive endorsement of Oldbrook First School and confirm that the current parent perception is of a happy, well performing school. The survey showed that 100% of respondents agreed with the statement "I would recommend this school to another parent".

Some areas have been highlighted to us as a school from your responses in which we will be looking into improving over the forthcoming term and next academic year. These areas in particular are where some parents responded with 'don't know' to questions or with a written comment.

I would like to thank you for your continued support and commitment to the school and look forward to another exciting year in which we continue to build on our strengths and successes as well as continuing to develop all aspects of the school.

### Summary

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that their Child is happy at school.

99.2% of parents agree or strongly agree that their Child feels safe at school.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that their Child is making good progress.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that their Child is taught well.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school helps to support children's needs.

96.8% of parents agree or strongly agree that their Child receives appropriate homework for their age.

97.6% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school makes sure children are well behaved.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school helps children develop basic skills – reading, writing, maths, communication.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school ensures their child is well looked after.

83.1% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school deals with bullying effectively. 15.3% of parents answered “don’t know”

99.2% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school helps parents to support their child’s learning.

97.6% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school responds well to their concerns.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school keeps them well informed.

98.4% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school encourages their child to be mature and independent.

97% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school provides equal learning opportunities for all children.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school informs them of their child’s progress.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school is led and managed effectively.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school has a welcoming atmosphere.

99.2% of parents agree or strongly agree that staff are approachable, helpful and willing to talk to parents.

98.4% of parents agree or strongly agree that they receive good advice and support from staff.

98.4% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school helps their child have a healthy lifestyle.

97.6% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school seeks the views of parents and takes them into account.

91.1% of parents agree or strongly agree that there is a good range of activities that their child finds interesting and enjoyable.

92.7% of parents agree or strongly agree that there is a good range of trips to support children’s learning. 5.6% responded “don’t know”

98.4% of parents agree or strongly agree that induction arrangements for starting school are good.

91.1% of parents agree or strongly agree that their Child is well prepared for the future, 8.9% responded “don’t know”.

100% of parents agree or strongly agree that they are happy overall with their child’s experience at school.

In addition to all the positive feedback, this year’s survey highlighted a number of areas for further consideration which we have already started to plan for.

- To develop further the range of trips to support children’s learning.
- To continue to offer more variety in after school clubs.
- To offer more parent workshops
